DESCRIPTION

SOPRASTOP ADHESIVE is a non-flammable bituminous-based adhesive developed to bond various building and construction materials. It is made from fast evaporating solvents, bitumen and SBS polymers, ensuring a rapid setting and improved adhesion strength.

SOPRASTOP ADHESIVE may also be used to adhere side and end laps of Kraft paper vapour barrier sheets.

In all cases, the components installed above the vapour barrier (Kraft paper) must be mechanically fastened.

<u>Application temperatures</u>: Winter Grade: -20 to 50 °C (-4 to 122 °F)

Summer Grade: 10 to 50 °C (50 to 122 °F)

<u>Service temperatures</u>: Winter Grade: -45 to 70 °C (-49 to 158 °F)

APPLICATION

To bond Kraft paper to steel roof decks, apply **SOPRASTOP ADHESIVE** directly on the flutes of the deck. It can be applied with a roller brush or in continuous ribbons. As an indication, a rate of 0.16 L/m² will be needed for using ribbons compared to around 0.10 L/m² for brushing application. APPLICATION COULD BE DIFFICULT IF TEMPERATURE IS TOO LOW. WARM UP THE ADHESIVE.
